As a global player in transport and logistics, CMA CGM places the preservation of the environment at the heart of its sustainability strategy.

The Group acts daily to reduce the carbon footprint of its activities, protect marine and inland biodiveristy and promote circular economy.

ACCELERATING THE DECARBONIZATION OF TRANSPORT AND LOGISTICS

Committed to reach Net Zero Carbon by 2050 across all its activities, CMA CGM is actively pursuing the ambition to reach two intermediary milestones for its shipping activities (in line with the upper trajectory of the International Maritime Organization): -30% of greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 and -80% by 2040 (reference: 2008).

The Group's decarbonization strategy is based on two pillars:

Reducing our energy consumption

To save fuel and reduce its carbon footprint, the Group focuses on operational excellence and continuously improves its fleet's performance with design innovation, including hydrodynamics and aerodynamics, and new propulsion technology.

3 fleet centers to assist crews with enhanced data to optimize routes and reduce fuel consumption

\$200 millions invested in the retrofit of existing vessels for the past 10 years

100% of CEVA Logistic's warehouses powered by renewable electricity by 2025


Using less carbon-intensive energy

Developing low-carbon energies is the main challenge for a more sustainable shipping industry. A pioneer in the use of LNG ships and biofuels, CMA CGM continues to diversify its energy mix by integrating new low-carbon fuels – biogas, biomethanol and synthetic fuels, both by acquiring adapted vesels and vehicules and by developing sustainable production channels.

\$15 billion committed to ordering 119 dual-fuel LNG and methanol ships, in fleet by 2028

1,450 electric vehicles operated for CEVA Logistics by 2025

2023 actions



From **COP28** in Dubai, CMA CGM's Chairman and CEO Rodolphe SAADÉ initiated a **unique coalition** with governments and major shipping companies to implement a global regulatory framework ensuring a level playing field and access to greener fuels for the industry.



- Created in September 2022 with a **1.5 billion** euros budget over 5 years, **CMA CGM's energy fund PULSE** has already supported **40 projects** alongside major groups, innovative start-ups and investment funds, in order to accelerate the energy transition of the Group and the entire transport and logistics sector.
- Carbon: a project based in Fos-sur-Mer which aims to become the largest gigafactory of solar panels in Europe
- Flexis: electric vans production project in Europe, in partnership with Renault and Volvo
- **Mob Energy:** start-up that develops mobile electric charging stations, from second-life batteries
- InnoEnergy: European Union Innovation Fund



PROTECTING BIODIVERSITY

Operating in every ocean and continent across the world, CMA CGM has a long-standing commitment in the conservation of marine and inland biodiversity.

We protect every specie our activities can interact with: first by using locating technologies (REPCET, Whale Safe) and by avoiding some routes (Northern Route, Hellenic trench) to limitate collisions at sea, then by reducing plastic pollution (no plastic waste has been transported on CMA CGM vessels since June 1st, 2022).

The Group also initiates partnerships to restore damaged ecosystems (corals, mangroves, posidonia, forests) and supports innovation and research (Ifremer, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, Sea Orbiter) for a sustainable use of the ocean.



2023 actions



■ CMA CGM and the **Fondation de la Mer** collaborate to preserve posidonia, lung of Mediterranean Sea. The funds will be allocated to 4 projects of protection and replanting of posidonia in Marseille, Corsica, Malta and Sardinia.



■ CMA CGM has chosen to modify navigation itineraries of its vessels in the **Hellenic Trench** (Greece and Crete) following recommendations from the NGO Ocean Care, to protect marine mammals in the area.



As the first private sponsor of the **French National Forestry Office (ONF)**, CMA CGM continues its commitment for the restoration of French forests, especially in the Var department where 7,000 hectares, or 80% of the Plaine of Maures national nature reserve, burned in summer 2021.



CMA CGM received the Green Marine Europe label, an environmental certification for the European maritime industry supported by Surfrider Foundation. The Méridionale also obtained this label.


ENGAGING AND TRAINING OUR EMPLOYEES

These efforts also include setting up a new MySociabble internal communication platform, an internal mobility policy to foster professional growth, and engagement surveys to better understand employees' needs.


Finally, CMA CGM encourages employees' involvement in social and environmental projects. In 2023, 19,000 staff members from 138 countries got involved.

As the Official Partner of the Paris 2024 Olympics and Paralympics Games, CEVA Logistics joins forces with Nes&Cité to hire 70 candidates from disadvantaged communities.



In 2023, the program **WE – Women Empowerment** has been launched in partnership with KEDGE Business School and Coach HUB. It aims at accelerating the professional development of women in the Group and promote their leadership.

For the third consecutive year, around **3,000 employees** got involved in the World Cleanup Day in 107 countries. More than **43 tons** of waste were collected.

acting for fair trade

In line with its commitment to responsible international trade, ethics and integrity are the pillars of the CMA CGM Group's cooperation with suppliers and customers. It offers its customers innovative and sustainable customized transport solutions, to assist them effectively in their decarbonization pathway. Finally, the Group's logistical expertise and resources are placed at the service of local communities around the world.

COOPERATING IN AN EXEMPLARY MANNER WITH OUR SUPPLIERS AND CUSTOMERS

The Group's commitment to a fair and equitable trade is reflected in concrete actions such as the implementation of strict policies to combat corruption and influence peddling, respect for competition law, and responsible data management.

Our value chain must be exemplary and guarantee respect for inalienable rights. The Group publishes an annual vigilance plan to identify and prevent violations of human, health and safety rights, as well as environmental risks related to our activities and those of our subcontractors or suppliers.

Finally, the Group supports its customers in the decarbonization of their supply chain, with innovative solutions based on the use of low-carbon fuels and modal shift from road to rail or barge.

ACTING CLOSELY WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES

In 2023, the CMA CGM Group strengthened its involvement with local ecosystems and communities.

CMA CGM has committed 1.4 million euros to support 744 actions in favor of communities and the preservation of the environment, in all its locations.

In addition, the Group supports innovative start-ups through its incubator ZEBOX and a partnership with Le Carburateur in Marseille, illustrating its commitment to sustainable innovation.

2023 actions



■ In 2023, more than **1 million tons of TEU** were transported with our low-carbon transport solutions Act With CMA CGM+, allowing to reduce and offset more than 500,000 tons of CO₂e emissions.



The CMA CGM Group has been awarded the **A- score** by the Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) in its 2023 climate index. This distinction highlights the **significant progress** made by the Group in the decarbonization of its shipping activities, as well as its **leading role** in accelerating the transition to a low-carbon transport and logistics industry.



In 2023, CMA CGM receives the "Label Relations Fournisseurs & Achats Responsables" recognizing French companies which have demonstrated **sustainable and balanced relationships with their suppliers**. It is awarded by the French Ministry of the Economy and Finance for a period of three years.

CMA CGM FOUNDATION

Chaired by Tanya Saadé Zeenny, the CMA CGM Foundation focuses its actions on two priority areas: humanitarian aid and education for all. The Foundation has shipped **35,000 tons** of basic necessities to 70 countries since the Containers of Hope program was created, supported **450 initiatives** dedicated to youth since 2005, and supported **35 social innovation projects** throught its incubator Le Phare established in 2021. In 2023, **638 CMA CM employees** got involved in solidarity actions.
